




Graduate Student Organization


- 4 primary functions:
 - Provide representative input on policies and decisions affecting UHM graduate students in general or a subgroup thereof;
 - 2. To provide an advisory body to the administration and faculty of UHM;
 - 3. To provide an organization from which graduate student representatives shall be selected for recommendation to serve upon campus-wide committees; and
 - 4. To initiate and maintain co-curricular programs that are relevant to UHM graduate students

Representative Roles and Responsibilities


- Represent the general will/opinion of department graduate students when voting
- Relay general assembly decisions to department graduate students
- Act as a resource within department with respect to system decisions affecting graduate students
- Be the knowledgeable source within the department for G&A applications
- Act as a liaison for bringing departmental concerns before the general assembly
- Foster interdepartmental relations between graduate students

























GSO GRANTS AND AWARDS

General Policies, Pt. 1

- Applications reviewed monthly during the Fall and Spring semesters
- Can request funding for: professional development, conference travel and fees
- Cannot request for: per diem, food, ground transportation, and personal expenditures
- May ask for funding up to 6 months prior and/ or 6 months post dates of travel

General Policies, Pt. 2

- For an application to be reviewed, the representative of the program/department must be present
- Each graduate student may only apply for and receive no more than 1 grant per academic semester

Funding Limits:	Minimum	Maximum
Domestic	\$250	\$1000
International	\$500	\$2000

General Policies, Pt. 3

- Applications tabled 3x for any reason will be automatically rejected
 - If representative is not present
 - No quorum
- Only complete and correct applications will be reviewed
- Incomplete applications will be automatically declined if they remain incomplete until the end of the semester

Graduate Student Organization (GSO) Grants and Awards Program

Description: The Graduate Student Organization (GSO) represents the academic interests of over 5,000 graduate students attending UH Manoa, the flagship campus of the UH System. Starting in 1975 the Grants and Awards fund was created to aid graduate students with presenting original scholarly, scientific or literary works at academic or professional conferences or workshops. In 2004, this was expanded to include funding of research materials and travel. The awarding of this grant is decided by vote of graduate peers on a monthly basis during the Fall and Spring semesters. GSO offers graduate students up to \$2000 for international travel and \$1000 for domestic travel or research funding. There are approximately 10-15 awards per month between \$2000 and \$150. Applications are due two weeks before each monthly meeting. Meeting dates can be found at http://gso.hawaii.edu. Once the application has been reviewed by the Graduate Assembly you will receive an email response within 14 days.

> Tips on applying: We recommend that you review the application questions first and then formulate your answers. Once your answers are drafted, fill out the application online and submit. Due to the short turn around period for this award, we advise that you follow-up with your two recommenders after submitting the application letting them know they will receive an auto email from the online application (your recommenders are required to send their letters electronically through the online award application). Should you have any questions or concerns please contact the person below. All information on your application will remain confidential as dictated by FERPA. Once your award application is submitted, the "status" of the award can be tracked on the "tracker" tab of the scholarships website. Graduate Students can only apply once per semester.


The purpose of this fund is to provide financial support to graduate students at the University of Hawai'i at Manoa for the following:

Some Things to Remember:

- Can upload supplemental information (i.e. flight/hotel cost comparisons, conference registration, etc.) to the budget upload question number 18
 - If attending a conference, applicant is REQUIRED to upload proof of attendance in number 18
- An individual can only submit once per semester
- Save to computer and upload to the application because you cannot save as you go
- Only completed applications can be submitted
- Tracker tab will show you the status of your application
 - Awaiting letters of recommendation submission
 - Awarded
 - Rejected
 - Tabled
 - Needs more information
